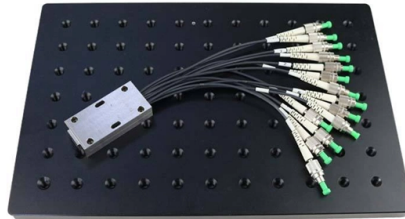


# 6-core optical fiber cable color chart
