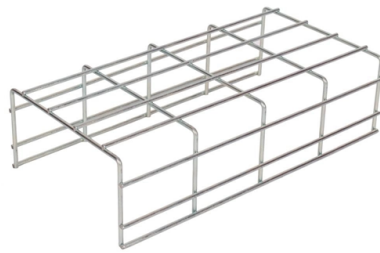


Are there fiber optic cables that don't require splicing
