Overview

A 12-core fiber optic cable is designed to carry twelve separate optical signals within a single protective jacket, making it ideal for high-density data transmission in data centers, enterprise networks, and telecom backbones. These cables can be single-mode (OS2) for long-distance runs or multimode (OM3, OM4, OM5) for short-range, high-speed connections. Jacket colors often indicate the fiber type: yellow for single-mode, aqua for OM3, erika violet for OM4, and lime green for OM5 .

Fiber Color Coding

The TIA-598-C standard defines a universal 12-color sequence for identifying individual fibers within a cable:

- Blue
- Orange
- Green
- Brown
- Slate (Gray)
