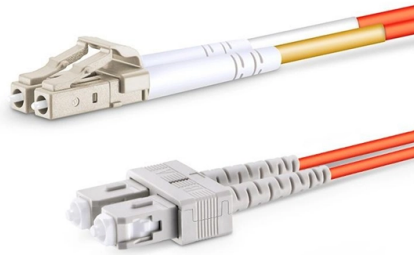

Multimode Fiber: Typical allowable loss is 2.9 dB for short-distance installations (100–300 meters). Fiber loss can be also called fiber optic attenuation or attenuation loss, which measures the amount of light loss between input and output. Losses in the optical fiber can be categorized. Fiber optic loss is one of the most fundamental parameters in optical network engineering, yet it is often misunderstood as a purely theoretical value used only during design calculations. In real-world deployments, fiber optic loss directly constrains transmission distance, split ratio, network. To be able to judge whether a fiber optic cable plant is good, one does a insertion loss test with a light source and power meter and compares that to an estimate of what is a reasonable loss for that cable plant.
