They often include rodent-resistant jackets and water-blocking layers to prevent moisture ingress. Direct-burial cables are cost-effective for underground deployments in areas with minimal mechanical risk . 3. Duct Installation: Fiber can be pulled through pre-installed ducts. This method is suitable for short distances and allows easier replacement, but longer runs increase tension and risk of fiber damage. Skilled personnel are recommended for duct pulling . 4. Blown Installation: Compressed air is used to blow microcables through ducts over long distances. This method is robust and increasingly popular due to miniaturized air-blown microcables, though it requires specialized equipment and can be costly . 5. Pushable Fiber: Cables can be manually or mechanically pushed from the distribution point to the subscriber premises. Preterminated pushable connectors reduce splicing labor and allow easy replacement if damaged .
