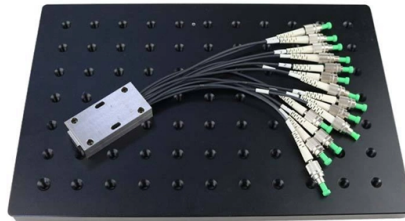


How to connect a red-light visual fiber optic patch cord
