The main cable tray connection methods include splice plates, bolted connections, quick connect systems, fish plates, clamps, and welding. Choosing the right one depends on project conditions, load. This guide breaks down the process step by step. Plan the Route Before You Drill No installation should start without a plan. If an EGC cable is installed in or on a cable tray, it should be bonded to each or alternate cable tray sections via grounding clamps (this is not required by the NEC® but it is a desirable practice). A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require.
