

How to strip a core from an optical cable

5. Expose the Fiber Core Once the outer sheath is removed, the core consists of color-coded buffer tubes around a central strength member. Carefully remove any binder strings, water-absorbent tape, or flame barrier layers to fully expose the fiber core .
6. Handle Fibers Carefully Trim any excess tape or protective layers with scissors. Avoid bending, twisting, or applying excessive force to the fibers, as this can damage the optical transmission properties .
7. Prepare for Termination or Storage After exposing the core, the fibers can be cleaned, terminated, or spliced according to your project requirements. Cover unused fiber ends with protective caps to prevent contamination or breakage .
