Equipment must be UL-listed or certified for industrial use. **Local Codes and Permits:** Cities like New York require compliance with the local electrical code, which adopts the NEC with amendments. Electrical work must be performed by licensed contractors, and permits are required for installation, alteration, or repair of distribution systems. Unauthorized work can result in fines, violations, and legal liability .
